

Appendix Three: California Health Programs for Uninsured Women

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Medi-Cal pregnancy only coverage¹

- ❑ \$500 million
- ❑ Covers perinatal care and comprehensive prenatal services

AIM (Access for Infants and Mothers)²

- ❑ \$120 million
- ❑ Covers comprehensive services for pregnant women up to 300% of FPL and infants up to age two
- ❑ 6,690 women

Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening and Treatment Programs³

- ❑ \$90 million
- ❑ Covers screening and treatment for women up to 200% of FPL

Family PACT⁴

- ❑ \$430 million
- ❑ Covers family planning services for men and women up to 200% of FPL
- ❑ 1.5 million individuals

Medi-Cal share of cost coverage for families⁵

- ❑ \$60 million
- ❑ Covers catastrophic health costs for families

Genetically Handicapped Persons Program⁶

- ❑ \$56 million (1/2 for women)
- ❑ Services to individuals with specified genetic diseases

Managed Risk Medical Insurance Program (MRMIP)⁷

- ❑ \$40 million
- ❑ 8000 subscribers (58% women, 2/3rds with incomes in excess of 300% of FPL)
- ❑ Premium subsidies for individuals denied coverage due to pre-existing conditions

County Health⁸

- ❑ \$1.8 billion expenditures (1/2 for women)
- ❑ Care for 1.3 million persons (eligibility varies by county)
- ❑ Benefits (varies by county)
- ❑ Delivery system (varies by county)
- ❑ Financed by state realignment, state Prop 99, county match, county litigation settlement (some counties), federal DSH (some counties), federal safety net care pool (some counties), federal coverage expansion (some counties)

Private Hospitals Bad Debt and Charity Care⁹

- ❑ \$1.4 billion in costs (1/2 for women)
- ❑ Financed by federal and state DSH equivalent subsidies and cost shift to private subscribers

Free and Community Clinics¹⁰

- ❑ \$495 million in costs of care to the uninsured
- ❑ 5 million uninsured visits
- ❑ 66% of patients were women
