FIGURE 4. Covered California Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, December 2021³




FIGURE 5. Covered California Enrollment by FPL, December 2021³

FIGURE 7. Medi-Cal Enrollment, February 2022^{4,5}





FIGURE 8. Medi-Cal Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity February 2022⁶


