


FIGURE 6. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, December 2021³

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FIGURE 8. Medi-Cal Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, April 20226




FIGURE 9. Medi-Cal Enrollment in Managed Care and Fee-For-Service (FFS), April 2022⁷


FIGURE 11. Medicare Enrollment and Percent of Counties' Population, 2020^{5,8}

Some of these drivers include access to safe housing, nutritious food, parks and green space, and even broadband and internet connectivity, all of which impact the ability of and opportunity for Californians to live their healthiest lives.


