

Figure 3. Covered California Enrollment, by County





Figure 4. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, April 2019



(2) Payer counties contract for services or reimburse private providers in the community; (3) Hybrid counties operate public clinics, but not public hospitals, and contract with private hospitals in the county; and (4) County Medical Services Program administers the MI program for 35 mostly smaller, rural counties.
