








Figure 9. Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Implementation Dates, by County⁹

Historically, county indigent care programs have been grouped into one of four models: (1) Provider counties deliver services to medically indigent (MI) residents through county- owned and operated hospitals and clinics; (2) Payer counties contract for services or reimburse private providers in the community; (3) Hybrid counties operate public clinics, but not public hospitals, and contract with private hospitals in the county; and (4) County Medical Services Program administers the MI program for 35 mostly smaller, rural counties.

In the Regional Model, at least two commercial plans provide most Medi-Cal services in 20 primarily rural counties. In the Geographic Managed Care Model, the state choses multiple commercial plans to deliver most Medi-Cal services in the county.
