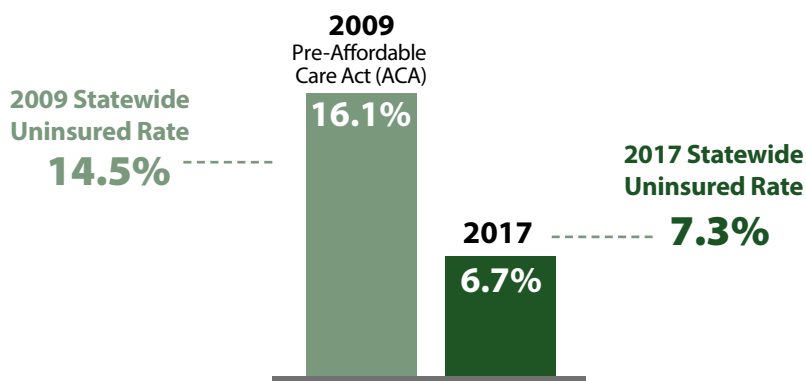


Figure 1. Percent Uninsured<sup>2</sup>

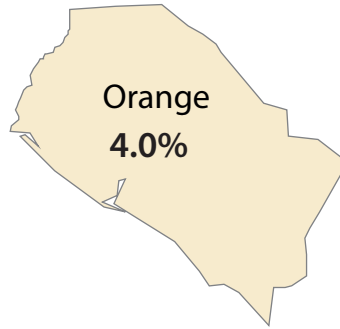

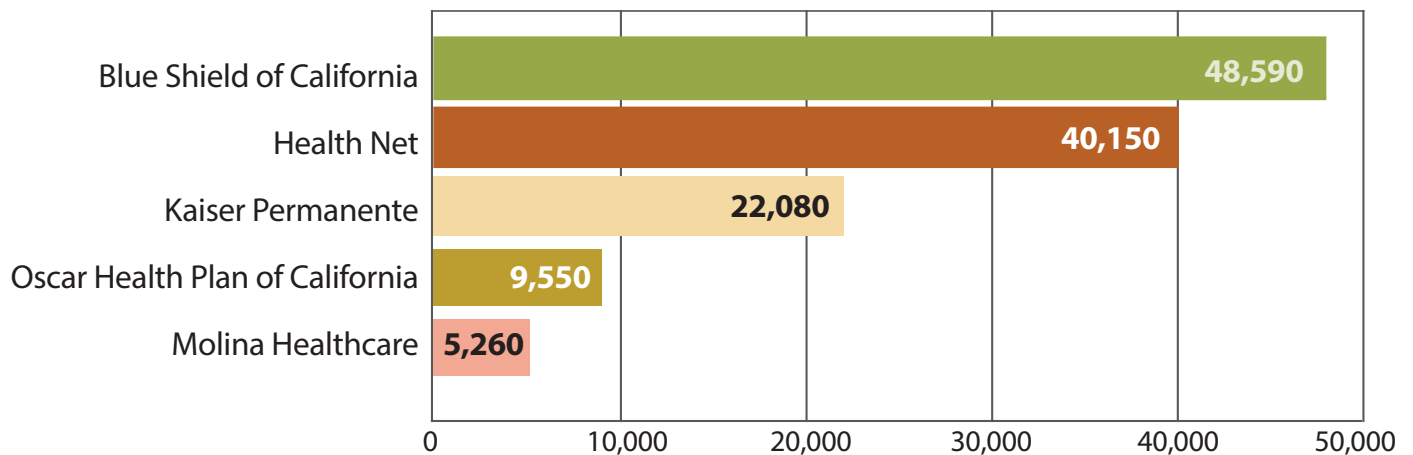
**Figure 2. Percent of County's Population Enrolled in Covered California**

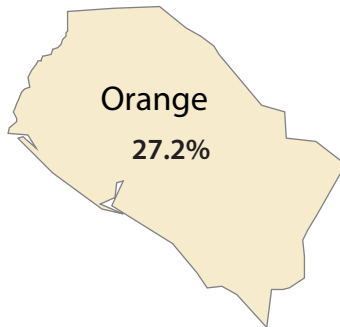
**Figure 4. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, April 2019**

Figure 5. Percent of County's Population Enrolled in Medi-Cal



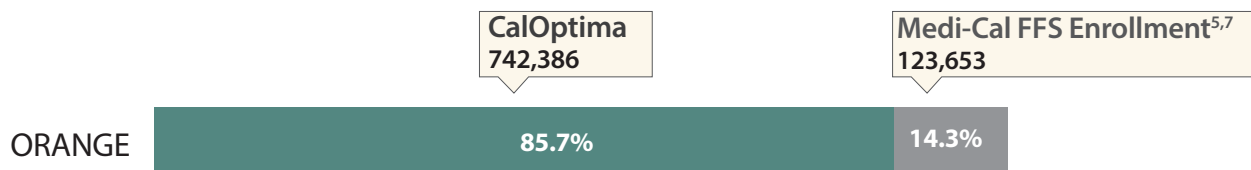

Historically, county indigent care programs have been grouped into one of four models: (1) Provider counties deliver services to medically indigent (MI) residents through county- owned and operated hospitals and clinics; (2) Payer counties contract for services or reimburse private providers in the community; (3) Hybrid counties operate public clinics, but not public hospitals, and contract with private hospitals in the county; and (4) County Medical Services Program administers the MI program for 35 mostly smaller, rural counties.
