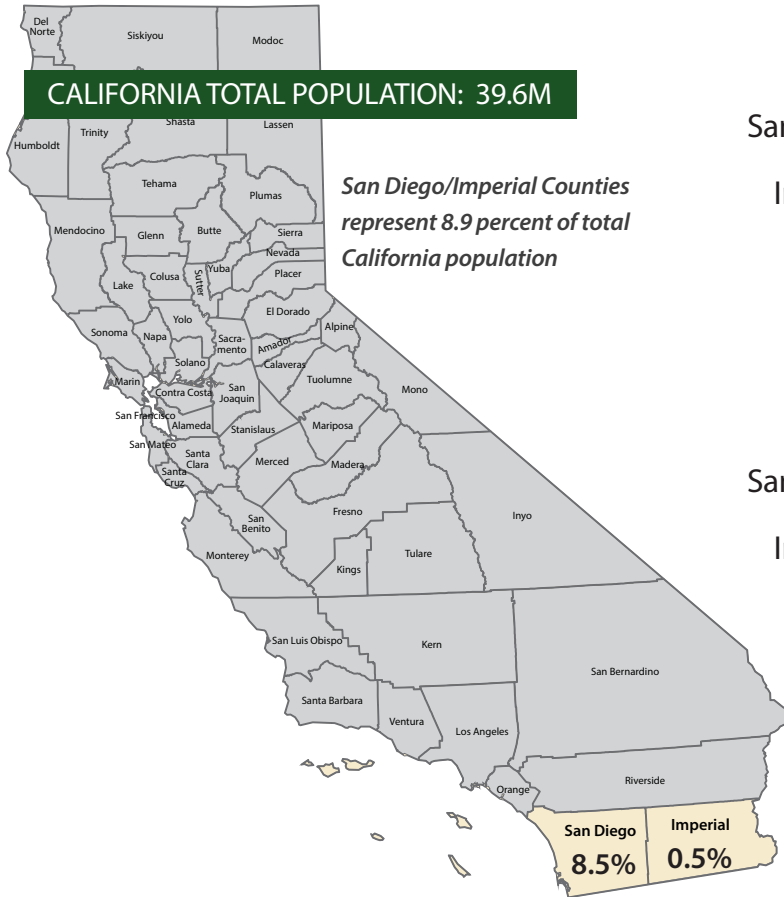

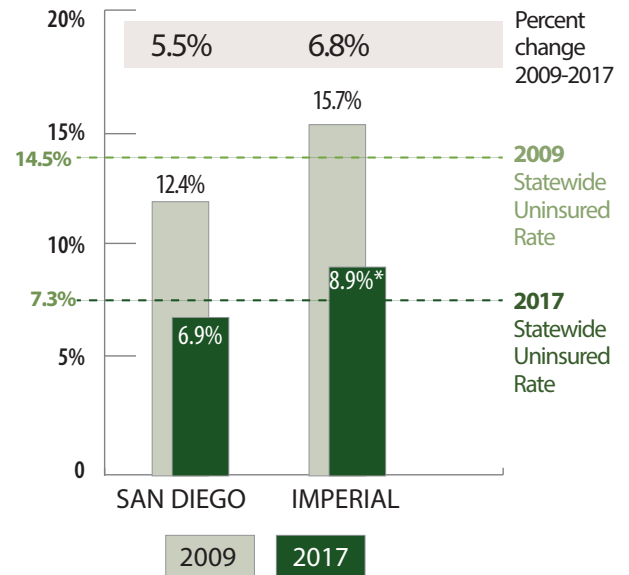

Figure 2. Percent of County's Population Enrolled in Covered California

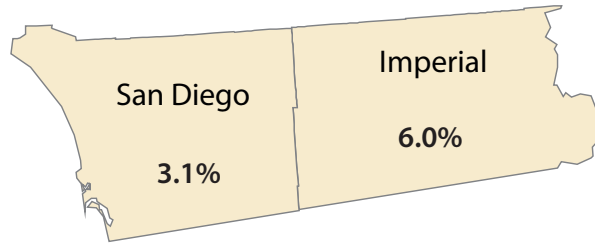
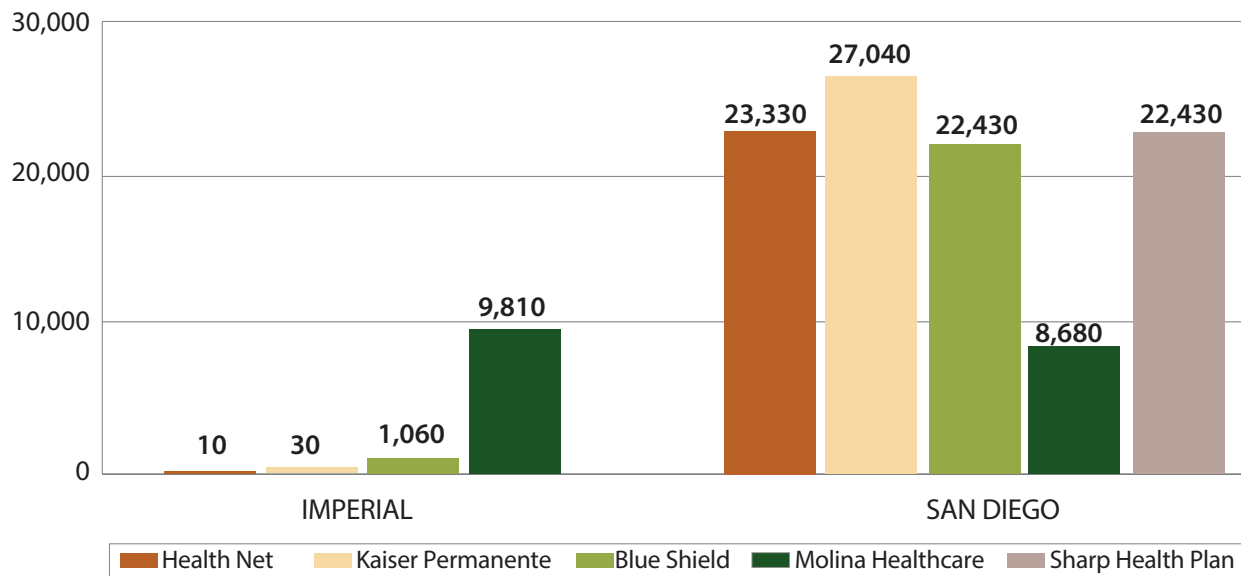


Figure 3. Covered California Enrollment, by County

Figure 5. Percent of County's Population Enrolled in Medi-Cal

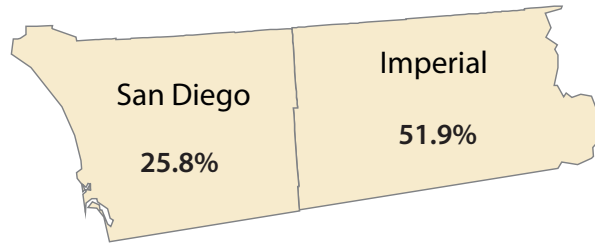


Figure 6. Medi-Cal Enrollment, by County

Figure 8. 2020 Waiver: Whole Person Care Projects<sup>8</sup>

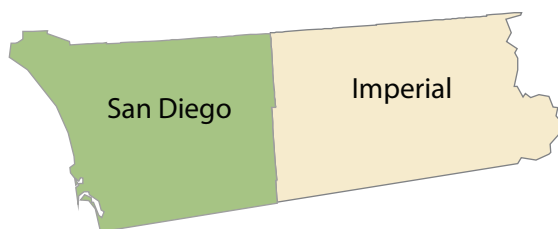
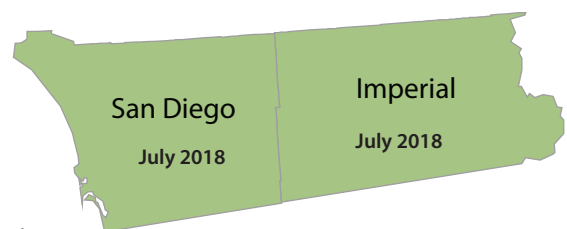


Figure 9. Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Implementation Dates, by County<sup>9</sup>

Historically, county indigent care programs have been grouped into one of four models: (1) Provider counties deliver services to medically indigent (MI) residents through county- owned and operated hospitals and clinics; (2) Payer counties contract for services or reimburse private providers in the community; (3) Hybrid counties operate public clinics, but not public hospitals, and contract with private hospitals in the county; and (4) County Medical Services Program administers the MI program for 35 mostly smaller, rural counties.
4. Covered California, [December 2018 Active Member Profile \(Preliminary\)](#), April 2019. Plan enrollment numbers shown only for qualified health plans offered in that county.

6. In the *Two-Plan Model*, one county-organized local initiative public health plan and a commercial plan deliver most Medi-Cal services in the county. A *County Organized Health System (COHS)* is a county-wide, public health plan originally organized by the county to serve all Medi-Cal beneficiaries. In the Regional Model, at least two commercial plans provide most Medi-Cal services in 20 primarily rural counties. In the Geographic Managed Care Model, the state chooses multiple commercial plans to deliver most Medi-Cal services in the county.
