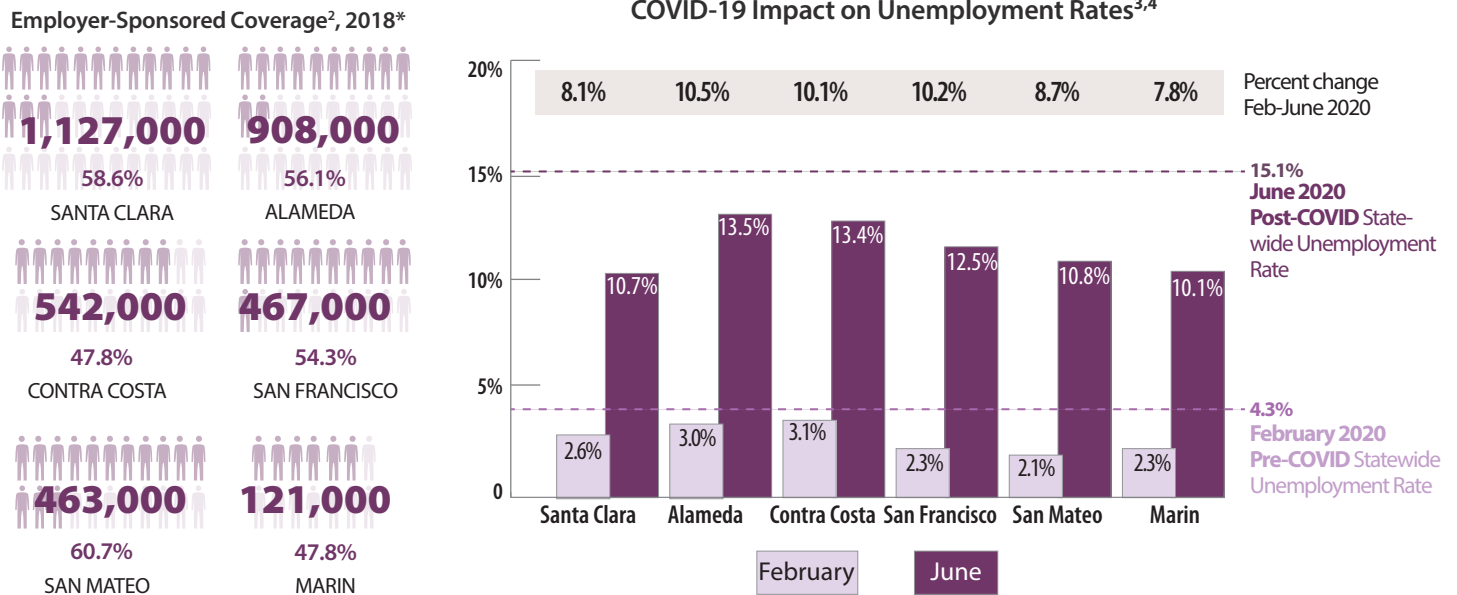

Figure 2. Covered California Enrollment by County, March 2020⁵

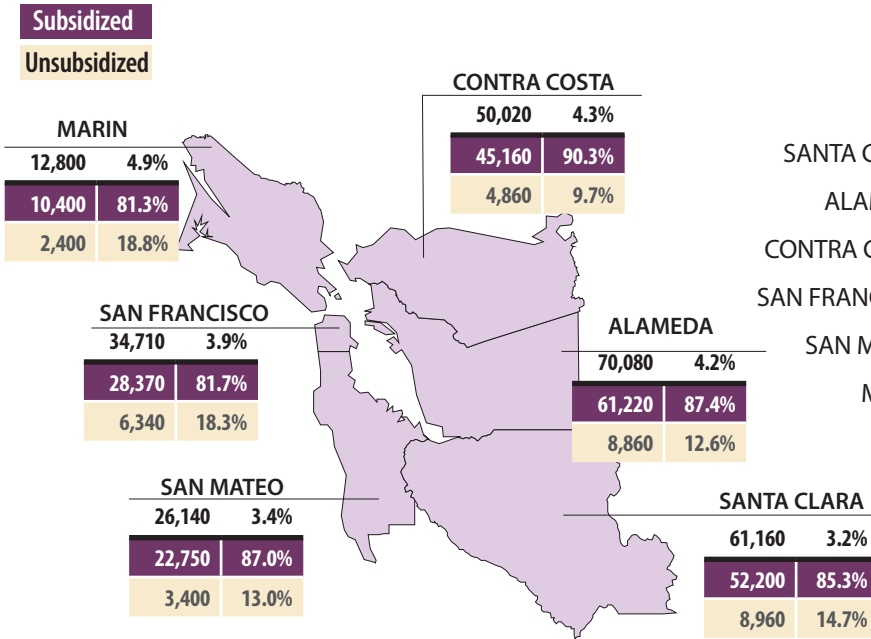
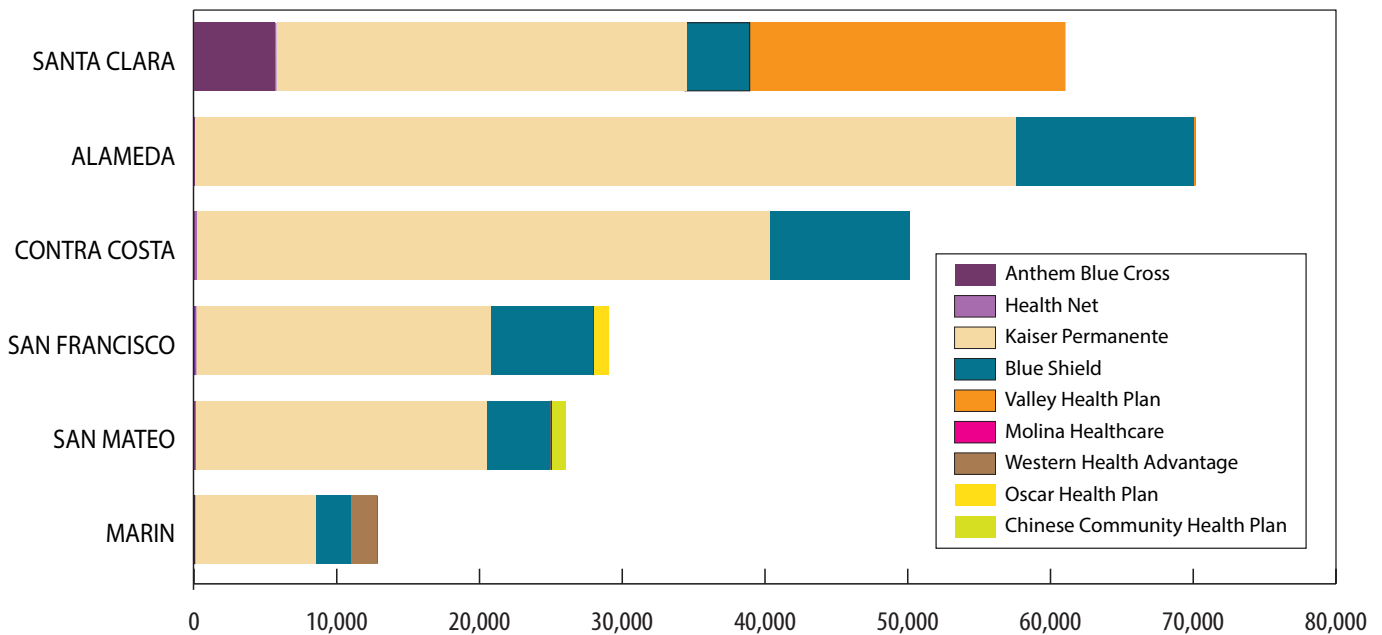


Figure 3. Covered California Enrollment by FPL, March 2020⁵

Figure 6. Medi-Cal Enrollment by Population and Percent of County, March 2020⁷

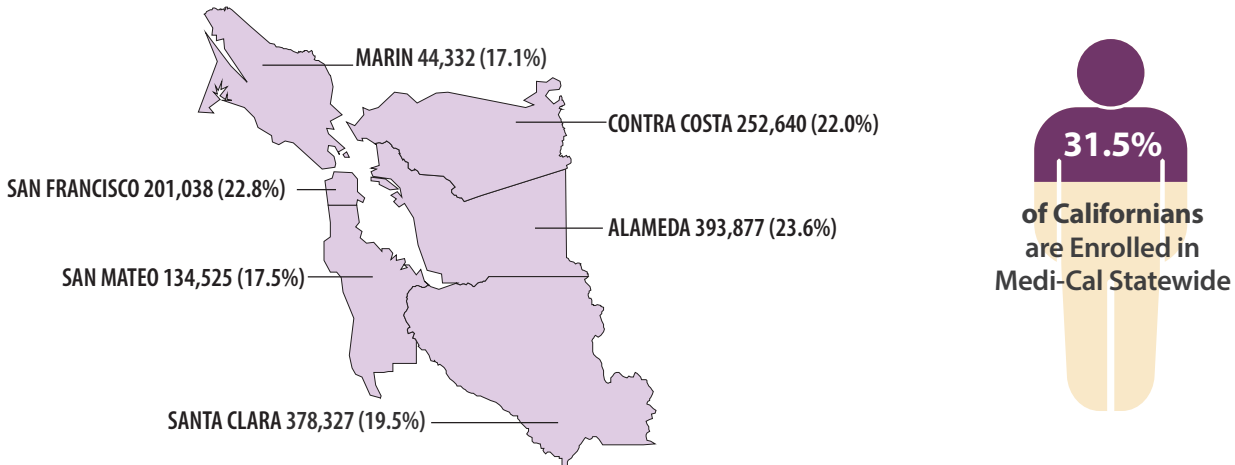


Figure 7. Medi-Cal Enrollment by Managed Care Model and Fee-for-Service (FFS), March 2020
