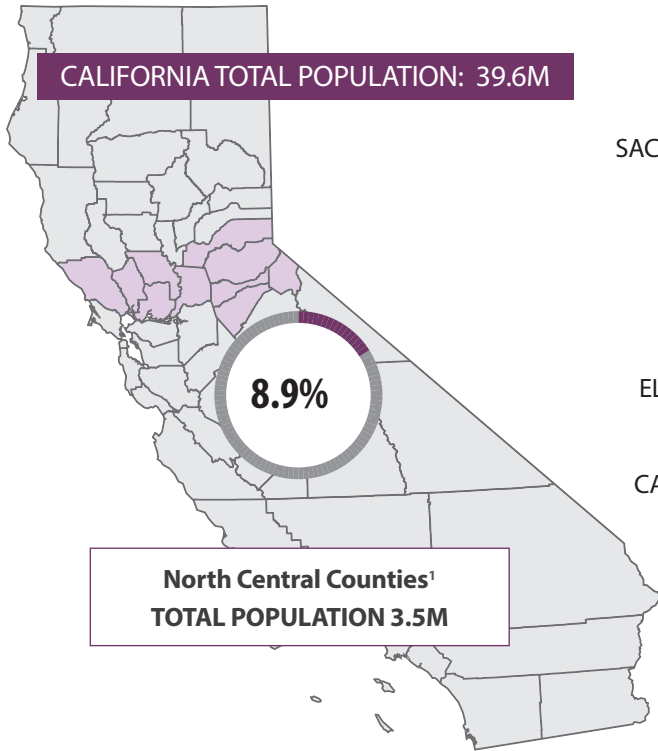

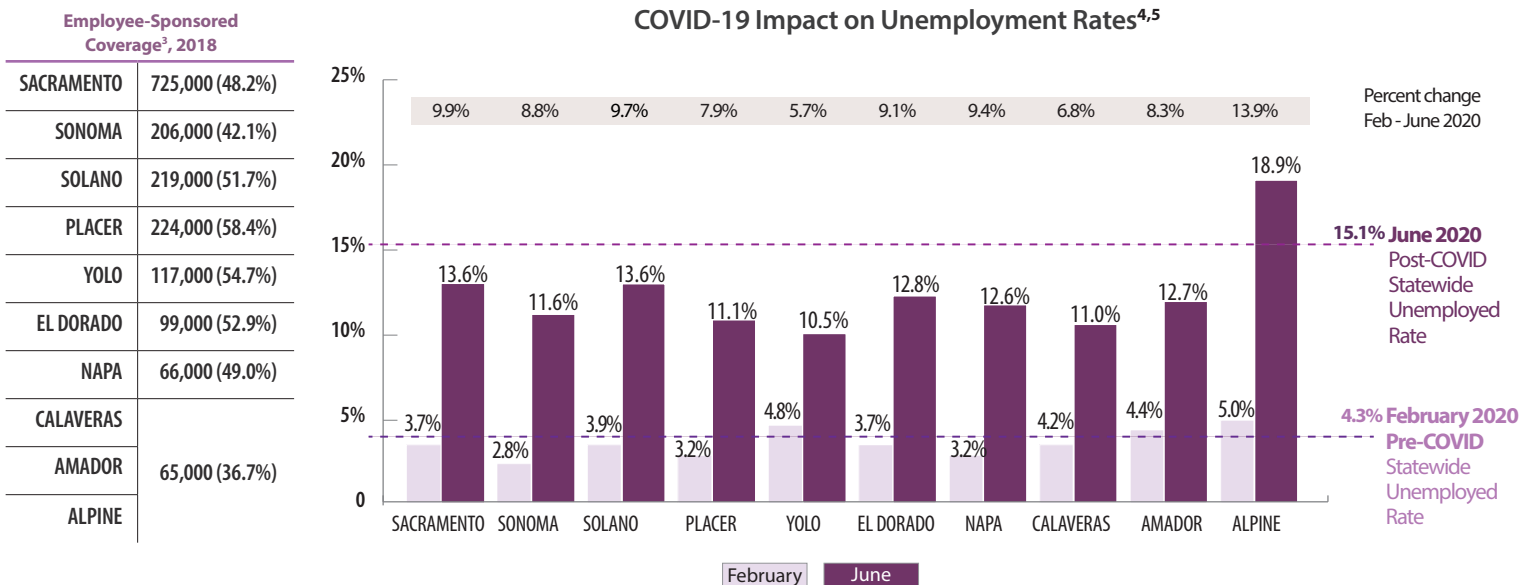

Figure 2. Covered California Enrollment by County, March 2020<sup>6</sup>

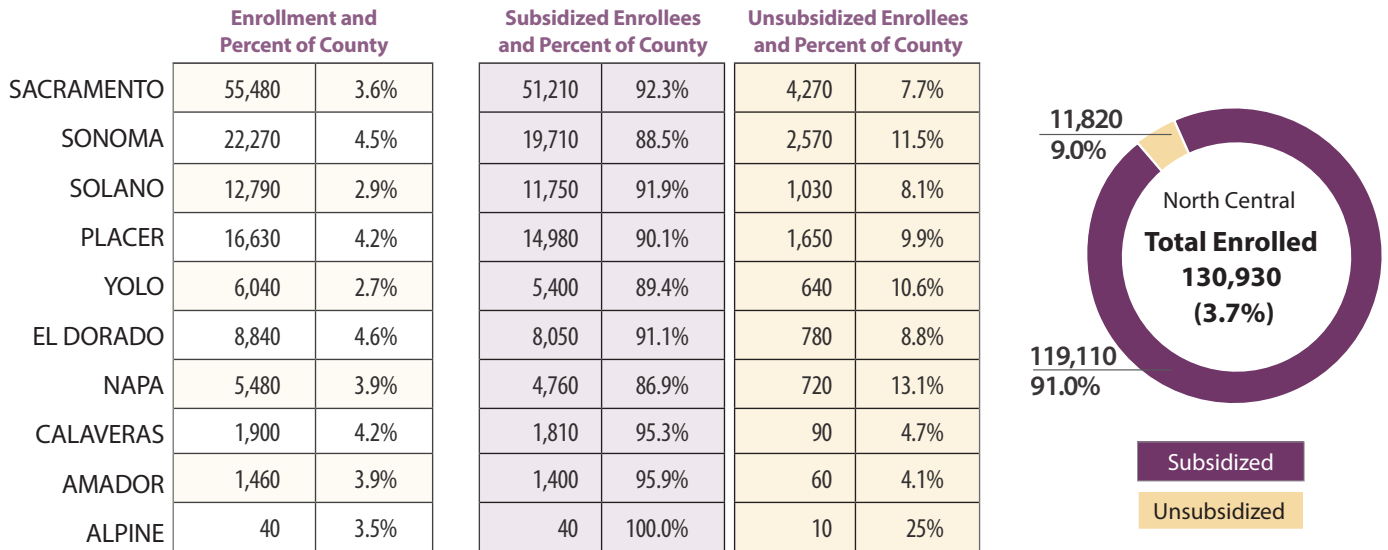


Figure 3. Covered California Enrollment by FPL, March 2020<sup>6</sup>

Figure 4. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, March 2020<sup>6</sup>

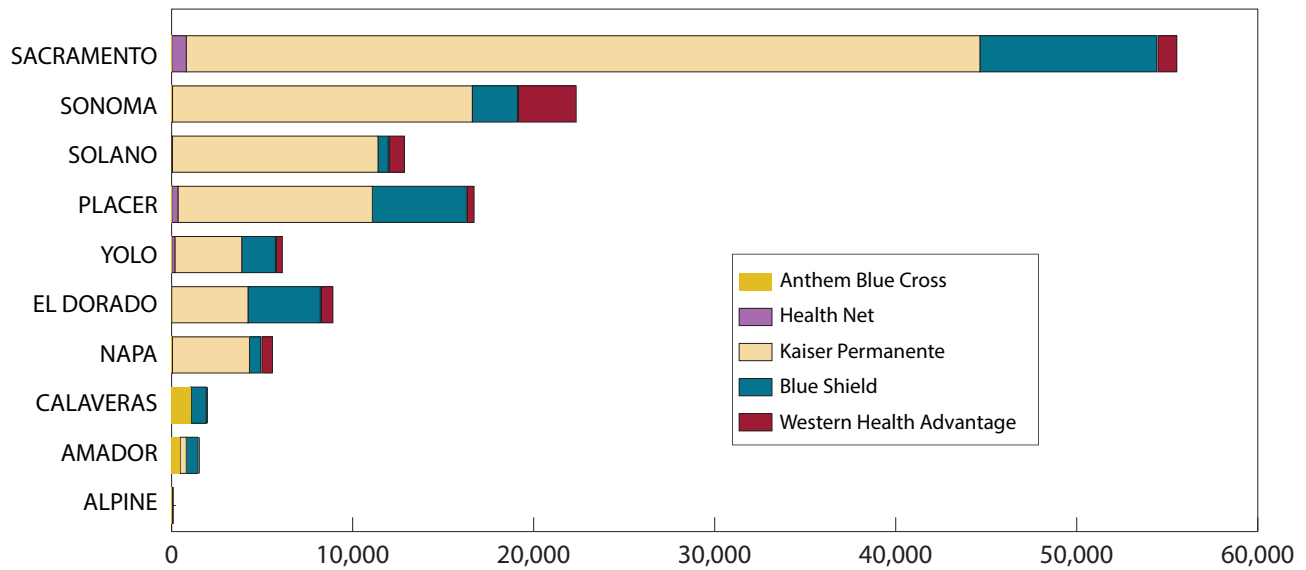


Figure 5. Impact of COVID-19 on Covered California Enrollment<sup>7</sup>

Figure 6. Medi-Cal Enrollment by Population and Percent of County, March 2020<sup>8</sup>

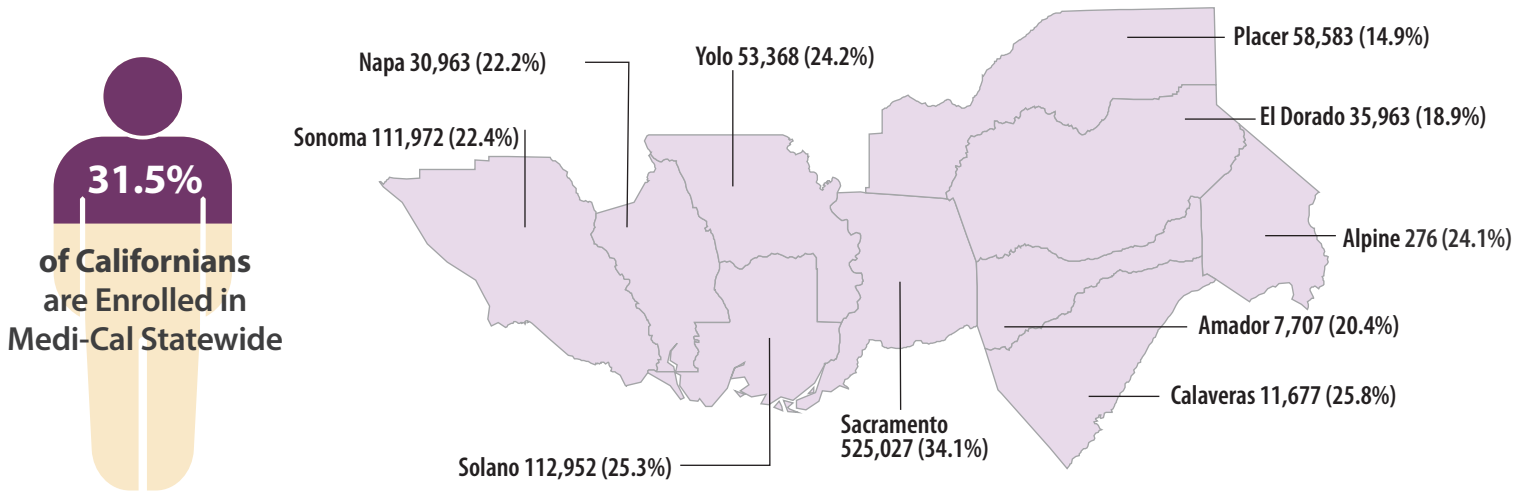


Figure 7. Medi-Cal Enrollment by County, June 2020
