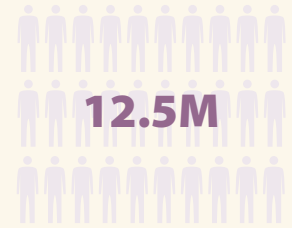

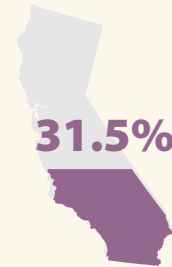

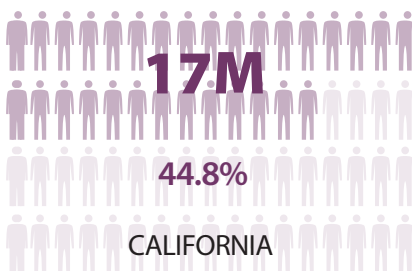

Figure 2. Population Enrolled in Covered California⁷

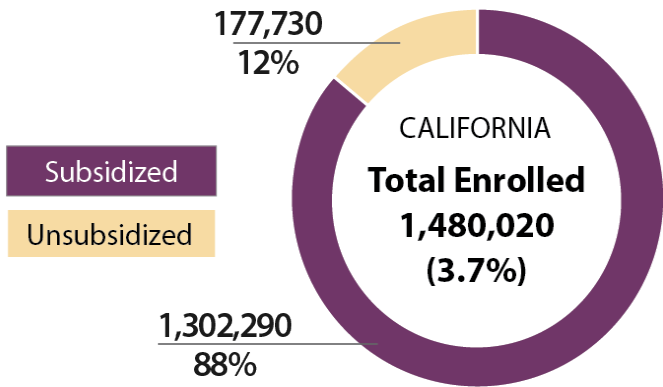


Figure 3. Covered California Enrollment by FPL, March 2020⁷

Figure 4. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, March 2020⁷

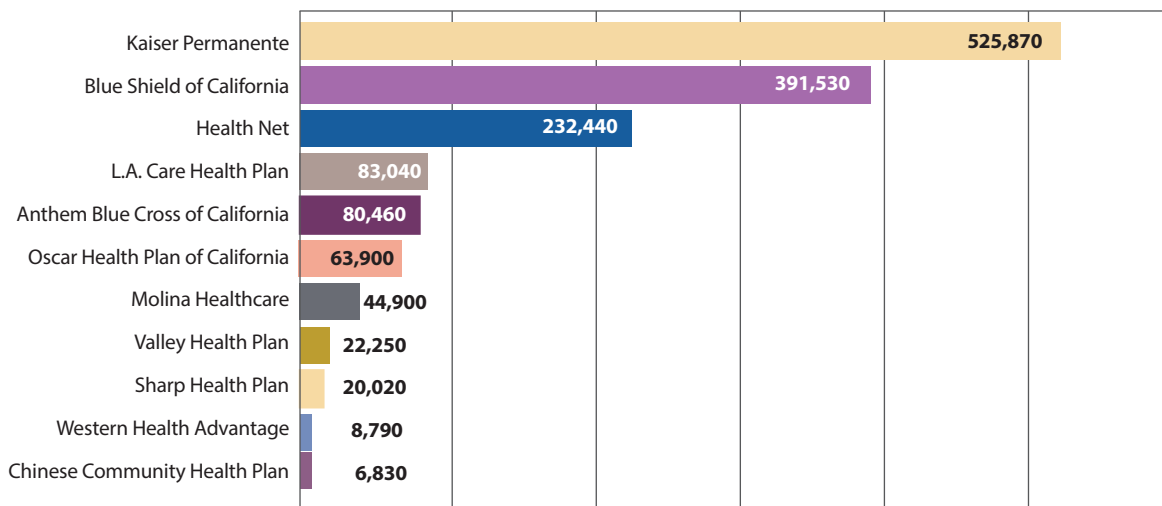
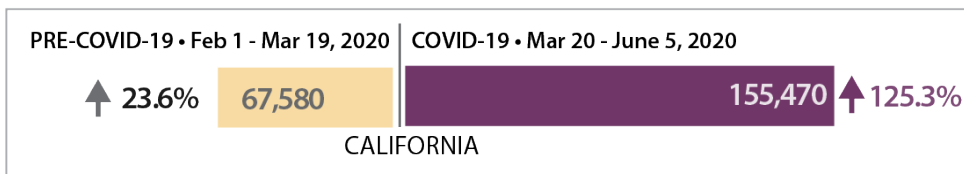


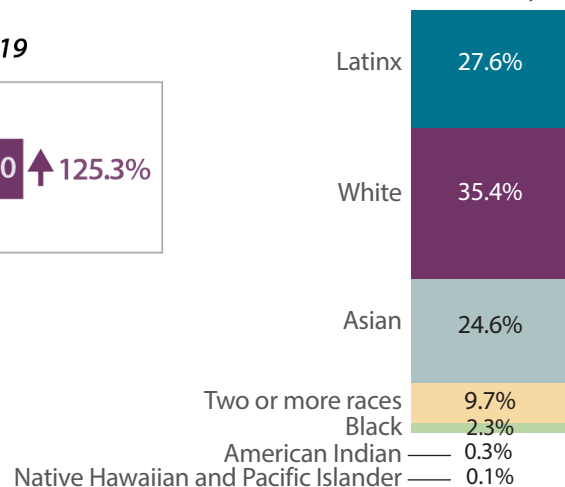
Figure 5. Impact of COVID-19 on Covered California Enrollment⁸

* SEP=Special Enrollment Period

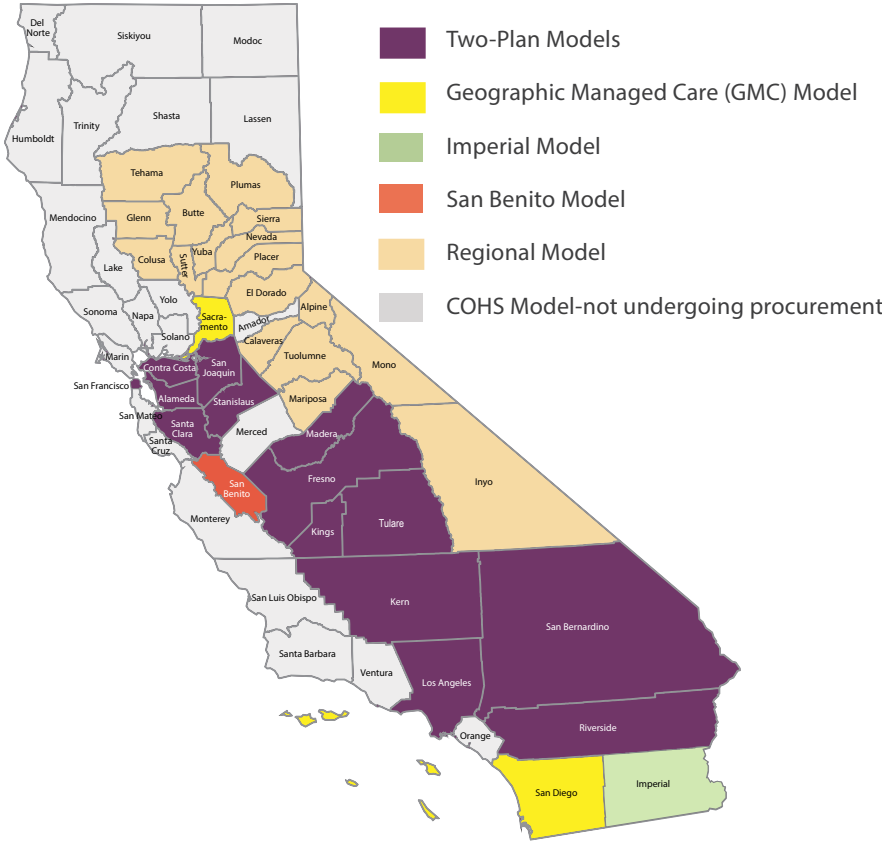
Covered California Enrollment, 2018⁷

Medi-Cal Procurement^{9, 10}

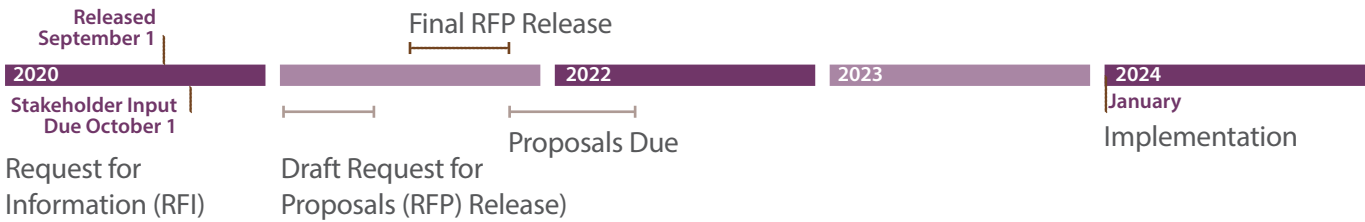
For the first time, the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) will procure all Medi-Cal Managed Care Plan (MCP) models, with the exception of County Organized Health Systems (COHS). The map below shows the counties undergoing procurement process.



Why Procurement?

1. Update the contract to make systemic changes to Medi-Cal MCPs’ business processes and compliance lists to:
 - a. Address health equity;
 - b. Use population health and hot-spotting to incentivize prevention, drive quality, and reduce health disparities;
 - c. Build upon community partnerships from Whole Person Care and Health Homes to make care person-centered and pay for services to address the social determinants of health; and,
2. Create an opportunity for new health plans to enter the Medi-Cal Managed Care market.
3. Ensure consistency across plan model types.
4. Improve compliance and oversight by making technical revisions to the contracts.

Figure 6. MCP Procurement Process and Timeline



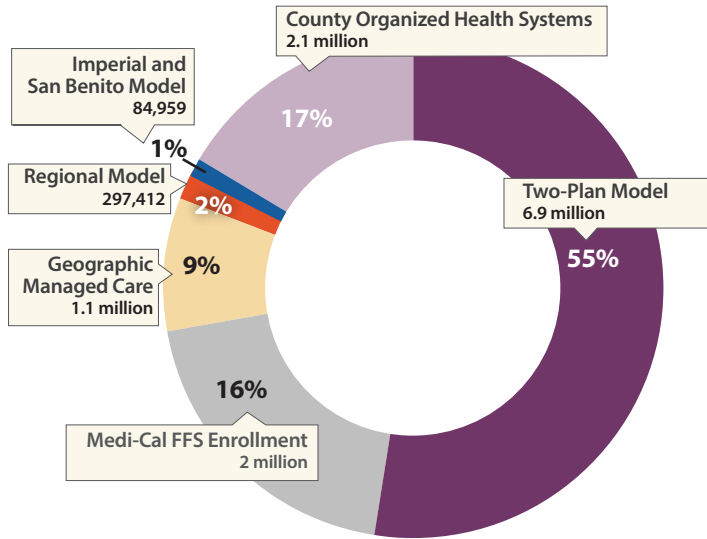
Ways to Engage

Draft RFP: Early 2021, DHCS plans to release a draft RFP that will include the proposed contract language based on DHCS’ priorities and stakeholder input through the RFI process. After the release of this draft, stakeholders will have the opportunity to engage with DHCS through:

1. Written comment and feedback,
2. Webinar with DHCS, to be announced after the draft RFP is released.
