



**FIGURE 3. Percent of Counties’ Populations Enrolled in Covered California, December 2021<sup>3</sup>**







Enhanced Care Management (ECM), a new Medi-Cal benefit under CalAIM has a phased implementation timeline.



**FIGURE 12. Medicare Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, 2020<sup>8</sup>**






## DATA SNAPSHOT: SOCIAL DRIVERS OF HEALTH




