




**FIGURE 6. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, December 2021<sup>3</sup>**



Enhanced Care Management (ECM), a new Medi-Cal benefit under CalAIM has a phased implementation timeline.





Some of these drivers include access to safe housing, nutritious food, parks and green space, and even broadband and internet connectivity, all of which impact the ability of and opportunity for Californians to live their healthiest lives.


