




FIGURE 6. Covered California Enrollment by Health Plan, December 2023³

FIGURE 8. Medi-Cal Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, March 2024⁶




FIGURE 9. Medi-Cal Enrollment in Managed Care and Fee-For-Service (FFS), February 2024⁷


